Our pedagogy is grounded in continuing revelation, reflection, integrity, and a willingness to accept responsibility. From Nursery to grade 12, our students participate in a process designed to foster creative, critical, and flexible thinking, along with compassion. As they transform from playful children to skilled, self-possessed teenagers, they are always intellectually curious and engaged thinkers. Ideal candidates will have experience teaching English, a bachelor's degree in the subject area, excellent interpersonal and communication skills, and an understanding of the developmental needs of and a passion for working with students in grades 9-12. Although not required, an advanced degree is preferred.

Responsibilities

- Be an enthusiastic teacher and supportive guide for Upper School-aged students
- Collaborate with faculty colleagues to develop and coordinate the English curricula
- Stay current with best practices in teaching and the teaching of English, including incorporating technology and differentiating instruction
- Be an engaged member of the Friends' Central faculty and wider community
- Have the mindset and ability to work in partnership with parents
- Enhance the School's commitment to diversity and inclusivity as outlined in our <u>Diversity Statement</u>.
- Understand and be committed to the School's Quaker values and mission.

Please note: Due to COVID-19, all applicants need to be prepared to teach in person, in a hybrid schedule (toggling between in person or virtual learning), and completely virtually using Canvas (our LMS) and Zoom. Teacher in-service begins in late August; teachers must be available to start at that time. Right now, we hope to open with in-person learning with all safety measures (physical distancing, universal mask wearing, etc.) in place.
